Dr. Dontá Morrison is a writer, producer, director, and nationally recognized community educator committed to improving the wellness of marginalized populations, particularly BIPOC LGBTQ+ individuals. For over two decades, he has fostered honest conversations around sex, identity, and spirituality—challenging stigma and dismantling exclusionary frameworks.

Dr. Morrison serves as the Director of Community Outreach and Engagement at the UCLA Care Center, where he promotes inclusive health strategies and drives awareness of HIV research through culturally responsive outreach. His leadership bridges the gap between science and community, especially in underserved populations.

He is the author of Faithful and Forgotten: Navigating Race, Sexuality, and Belonging in the Black Church, a powerful exploration of Black queer identity within religious spaces. A sought-after lecturer, Dr. Morrison has spoken at universities and conferences across the U.S., India, the U.K., and West Africa on topics including sexual health, LGBTQ+ inclusion, and religious trauma.

Dr. Morrison is also co-owner of WATCH VIM, a streaming platform that amplifies LGBTQ voices of color through curated films, series, and stories. In addition to his advocacy and global teaching, he serves in ministry at Church One Ministries in Long Beach, CA, and has received multiple honors from city, county, and state officials for his work in community empowerment.
